The following is a summary of the safety standards and guidelines in place to address COVID-19.

Our number one goal, this year more than ever, is the health and safety of the campers and staff. The summer camp program will follow the recommendations of Centers for Disease Control (CDC) as well as state and local health guidelines. We are developing extensive protocols to meet these recommendations and guidelines that will be strictly enforced to ensure that our environment is safe for your camper. We have modified previously scheduled camp activities and procedures to ensure safety, while providing children with a fantastic camp experience.

The only way we can all remain safe, is to self-check and provide honest answers to the daily screening questions. We encourage everyone to be mindful of your health status; as well as those in your home environment.

1. Prior to heading to camp, please take a moment at home to check your camper for any symptoms of being sick. If your child is sick or showing any signs of being ill, please keep them at home.
2. Camp directors will monitor the health of all campers and staff. If there is any question of a camper being ill, they will be sent home or parents called to pick camper up. The child will be moved to the KidSpace until they are able to be picked up by parent or caregiver. The child and staff will be required to wear a face covering and maintain social distancing within the care area.
3. If we are told about a case of possible COVID-19 or identify a case, we are mandated to notify the Local Department of Health, State Health Department, and Youth Camp Safety Project.
4. Signs will be posted showing recommendations on social distancing, hand washing, and face coverings.
5. To limit the access to camper area, all drop off and pick up will be curbside.
6. Campers are to wear face masks during the drop off and pick up process.
7. All PEAC staff will wear face coverings when in close proximity to campers and other staff.
8. We will be requiring a pre-arrival COVID-19 screening self-assessment each week your child attends camp.
 - a. Have you been ill with a fever, chills, cough or body aches in the last 14 days?
 - b. Has anyone in your household had these symptoms in the last 14 days?
 - c. Have you or anyone in your household traveled internationally in the last 14 days?
 - d. Have you or anyone in your household traveled to a location in the US where an increase of COVID-19 has been reported in the last 14 days?
 - e. Have you been told by a healthcare professional that you should self-quarantine due to potential COVID-19 exposure or you are suspected of having COVID-19?

9. We will be administering temperature checks of all campers and staff each morning upon their arrival. Temperature must be under 100.4 degrees to enter camp.
10. All campers will be educated and trained on new safety guidelines and health standards at the start of each day.
11. We will be keeping campers in smaller age/ability groups to ensure the wellbeing of all campers. Social distancing protocol will be followed when not in small groups. Masks will only be required when not in small group setting.
12. When parents arrive for pick up, campers will be escorted to the car in mask by PEAC camp staff.
13. All children will be asked to sanitize hands upon arrival each day and before leaving at the end of the camp day. Children will be asked to wash hands between activities.
14. All equipment will be disinfected after use. Facilities will be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected at the end of each day.
15. All campers will need to bring their own personal water bottle filled each day. **Water fountain use will not be permitted.** Snacks will be provided each day.
16. Full day campers will need to bring a packed lunch every day. We will not be able to provide lunches on Monday and Friday this season.
17. Reminder: campers cannot be admitted without a completed medical questionnaire and current immunization record.
18. Personal items; toys, stuffed animals are not permitted.
19. Lunchs should be packed in disposable wrap in disposable bags. Cloth cooler bags are not recommended.

We have implemented increased cleaning measures to ensure the health and wellbeing of our campers and staff.

- > There will be multiple sanitizing stations throughout the camp areas; including disinfectant wipes and/or hand sanitizer.
- > All toys, games and equipment will be wiped down immediately after use.
- > High touch surfaces in lobbies and restrooms will be disinfected and sanitized multiple times per day.
- > All indoor rooms and areas will be thoroughly cleaned with the use of a 'fogger' at the end of each day.
- > Hospital grade disinfectant and sanitizing wipes have always been a staple in PEAC's cleaning protocol. This, in addition to clorox is used throughout our entire facility.

Campers will be required to use hand sanitizer and wash their hands often throughout the day.
